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## INTRODUCTION

The Meal Deal functionality from Go has been developed to give the operator the ability to select individual products as part of a Meal Deal. For example a Meal Deal may consist of a Pie, a Pint and a Snack. Now the User will be able to select from a list, the specific components of the Meal Deal, such as the type of Pie, the type of Pint and the type of Snack that they would like to make up their Meal Deal.

The table below gives an overview of the areas that can be found in this document regarding Meal Deals.

# MEAL DEALS

### 1. MEAL DEAL SETUP

Before Meal Deals can be configured a range of setup requirements must be done.

Before any of the Meal Deal Configurations are created, it is important that Variant Types, Variant Price Lists, a Default Sales Plan and Channel Price List have been setup. Some of these may already be setup within the system and therefore will not need creating again.

### 2. MEAL DEAL CONFIG

There are many ways a Meal Deal can be configured within CRM 2015. Each configuration listed in this document will sell the Meal Deal differently. For example Meal Deal 1 will be sold as a standard Bookable Product with no option to select the particular products within the Meal Deal whereas Meal Deal 2 and 3 allow options of products which form Meal Deal.

### 3. OPTIONAL EXTRAS

After configuring a Meal Deal in CRM it is also possible to have Optional Extras displayed which the operator can add to the Meal Deal for an extra cost.

For example a customer may have elected to have a Meal Deal, and with this particular Deal for an additional cost it may be possible for the operator to select another product that can be sold with the Meal Deal.

### 4. MEAL DEAL REPORTS

A Meal Deal Report is available within CRM 2015 and can be generated to display the Meal Deals sold and the Meal Deal choices that have been selected. Any optional extras that have been added to the Meal Deal are also shown in the report. This allows the status of certain Meal Deals to be reviewed quickly and easily.

## 1. MEAL DEAL SETUP

The setup section of this document gives instruction on the initial setup that must take place before it is possible to place a Meal Deal on sale. Before any of the [Meal Deal Configurations](#) can be set up, the setup shown below must have taken place.

# 1. MEAL DEAL SETUP

### 1. VARIANT TYPES

Variant Types are the different types of the Bookable Product that you can purchase. For a Meal Deal the Variant Type of Deal needs creating. A Variant Type only needs to be created once and can then be reused.

### 2. VARIANT PRICE LIST

Variant Price Lists are selected in the Variant and Pricing section of the Bookable product form, which is where the price of the Meal Deal is entered. They are subsequently entered into Channel Price Lists, with separate Lists controlling different pricing structures.

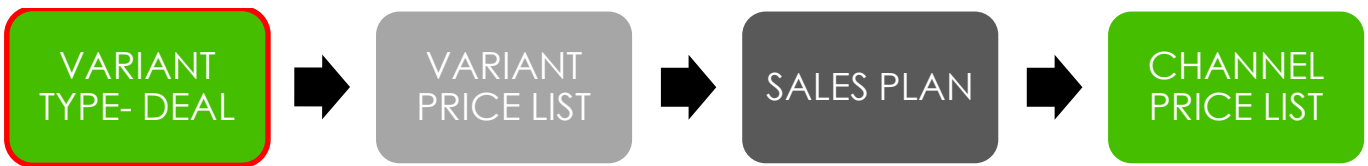
### 3. SALES PLAN

All products must be linked to a Sales Plan to appear on Sale. They assist with the management and administration of placing products on sale. A Sales Plan type of Other would need creating for Meal Deals.

### 4. CHANNEL PRICE LIST

Channel Price Lists control the times of sale and potentially the different price categories of a Product. They are linked to Sales Plans and in return, the Channel Price Lists link the Channel that the product is to be sold and the Variant Price List together. For each Channel and Variant Price List combination on the Bookable Product form, a new Channel Price List is needed.

## 1.1. VARIANT TYPE- DEAL



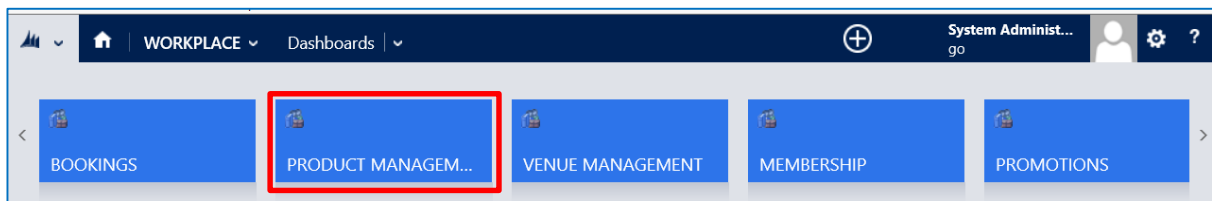
Variant Types describe the type of Bookable Products that can be purchased and for Meal Deals a Variant Type of **Deal** needs creating.

When a Variant Type has been created in the Go system, it can be reused for different product types. Before setting up a new Variant Type, check that it does not already exist, if it does, this step can be skipped.

The Variant Types are added in the Variant and Pricing section of the Bookable Product form having been chosen from the drop down list.

To create a new Variant Type record:

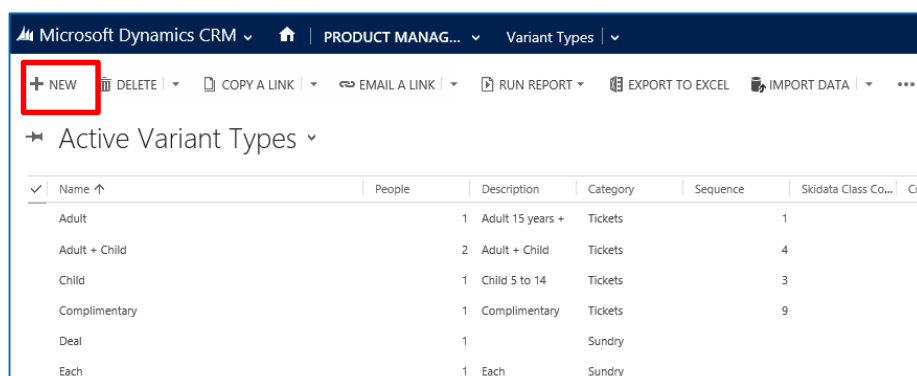
- Select or hover over the **Microsoft Dynamics CRM** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Product Management**.



- Next, in the Product Management area of CRM, select the **Product Management** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Variant Types**.



- A list of currently Active Variant Types will be displayed, remember that a Variant Type only needs creating once as it can be reused. To create a New Variant Type, choose **New** on the ribbon.



d) A blank Variant Type form will be displayed, complete the following details:

- **Name.** Enter a name for the Variant Type e.g. Deal
- **Translated Name.** This field is only used when the system is being translated into another language.
- **Description.** If applicable, enter a description of the Variant Type.
- **Sequence.** If applicable enter a sequence number for the order the Variant Types are to be displayed in.
- **People.** Enter the number of people included in the Variant Type. For a Variant Type of Deal, enter 1.
- **Category.** If applicable, use the Look Up to find or create a new Category for the Variant Type, for example, a category named Meal Deal could be created. By categorising this it will make it easier to find the appropriate Variant Type when adding them in the Bookable Product.



**Note.** All other fields in the Variant Type form that have not been described above do not need to be completed/changed.

e) Select **Save and Close** on the ribbon to save the Deal Variant Types.

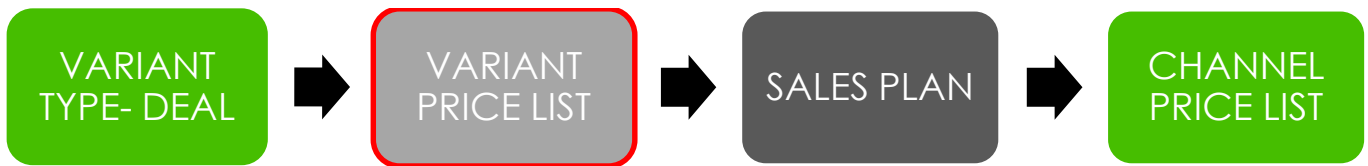

## 1.2. VARIANT PRICE LISTS

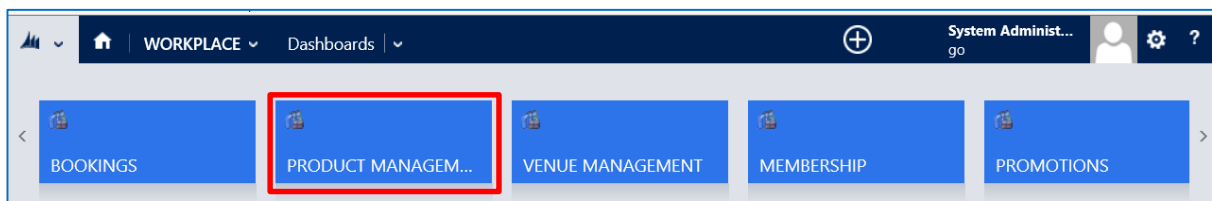


A Variant Price List must be created as this is where the cost of a product is entered into for the Deal Variant Types in the Variant and Pricing section of the Bookable Product form. The Variant Price Lists are also subsequently linked to the Channel using the Channel Price List entity.

One Variant Price List can be created for all Meal Deal Bookable Products.

To create a new Variant Price List for the Meal Deals, complete the following:

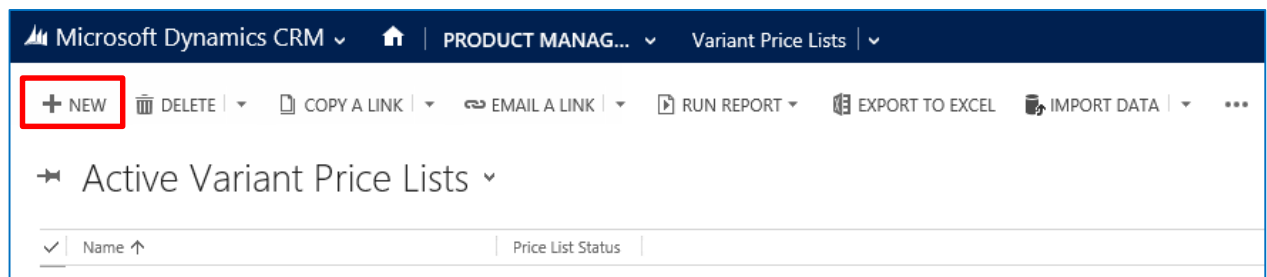
- Select or hover over the **Microsoft Dynamics CRM** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Product Management**.



- Next, in the Product Management area of CRM, select the **Product Management** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Variant Price Lists**.



- A list of currently active Variant Price List view will be displayed. Select **New** on the ribbon.



- The Variant Price List form will be displayed. Complete the following details:

- **Name.** Enter a name for the Price List.
- **Price List Status.** Select the Price List status from the drop-down list. Only price lists with a status of **Active** will be used to provide pricing information.

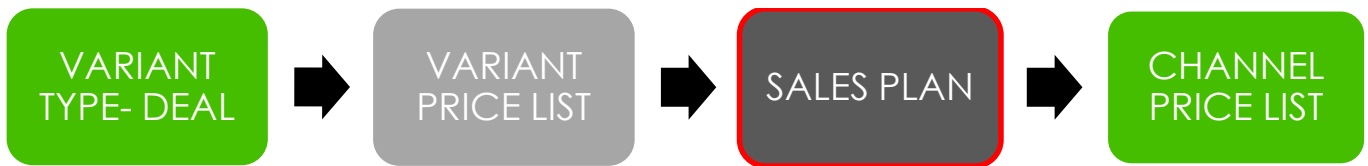
e) Select **Save and Close** on the ribbon, repeat the above process for each Variant Price List that needs to be created.

### 1.3. SALES PLANS

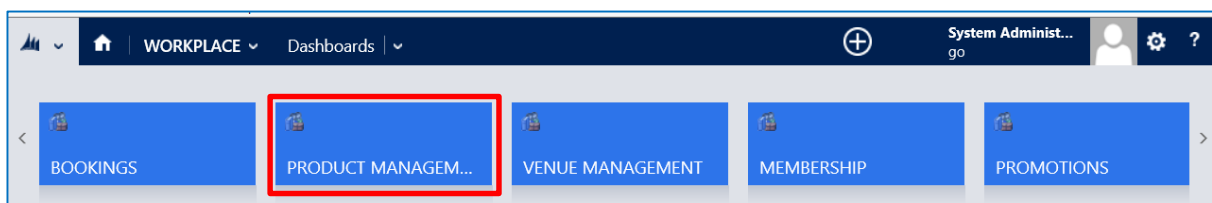


Sales Plan functionality assists with the management and administration of putting products on sale. They are used for all product types.

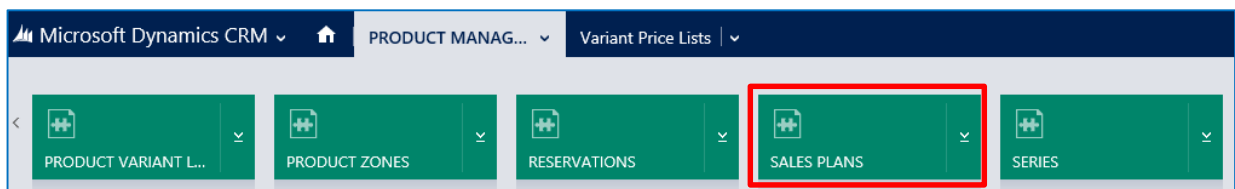
For Meal Deals only one Sales Plan of type Other needs to be created. If a Sales Plan of type Other already exists on the system then this section can be skipped to the [Channel price list section](#).

To create a new Sales Plan of type Other, complete the following:

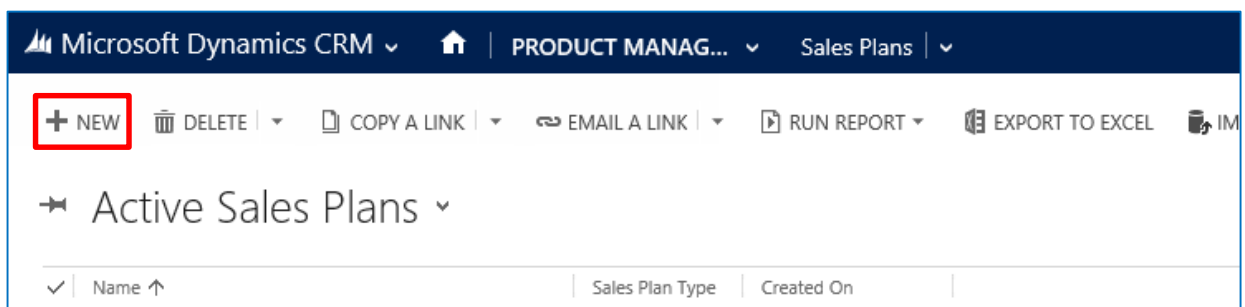
- Select or hover over the **Microsoft Dynamics CRM** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Product Management**.




- Next, in the Product Management area of CRM, select the **Product Management** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Sales Plans**.



- A list of currently active Sales Plans will be displayed, select **New** in the ribbon.



d) A blank Sales Plan form will be displayed. Complete the following:

- **Name.** Enter a name for the Sales Plan.
- **Sales Plan Type.** From the drop down menu select the Sales Plan Type of **Other**. Please note that only one Sales Plan type of Other needs to be created and it should be added to the **Current Sales Plan** field of the **Company Details** form in CRM.

e) Select **Save and Close** on the ribbon.

A Sales Plan of type Other has been created as examples for this document and is displayed in the table below. Channel Price Lists must then be linked to the Sales Plan, (shown in the next section).

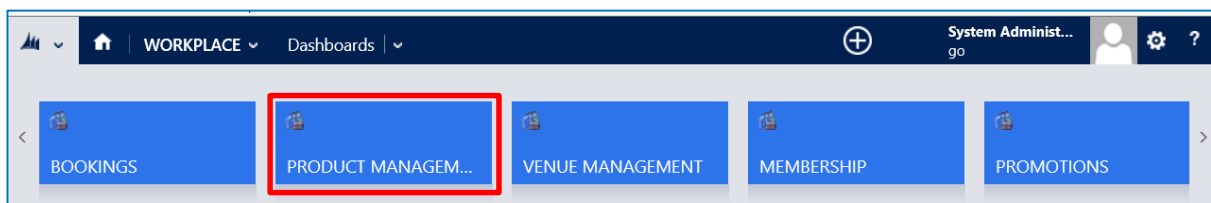
## 1.4. CHANNEL PRICE LISTS

Linked to [Sales Plans](#) are Channel Price Lists. Channel Price Lists link the Channel and Variant Price Lists together, for each Channel and Variant Price List combination in a Bookable Product a new Channel Price List must be created. Furthermore, the Channel Price List controls when a product goes on and off sale.

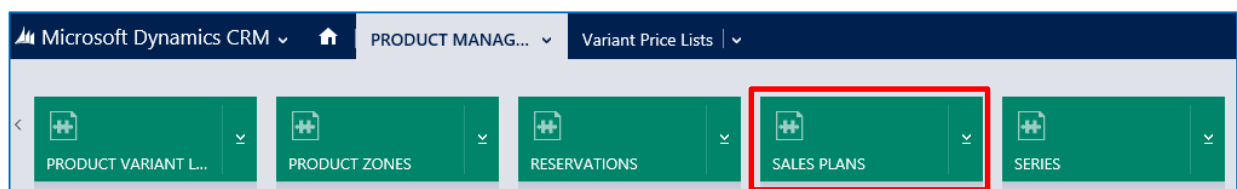
Different fields within the Channel Price List need completing depending on the type of product that is to be placed on sale. The example below show the fields that need completing when creating a Meal Deal.

To create a new Channel Price List complete the following:

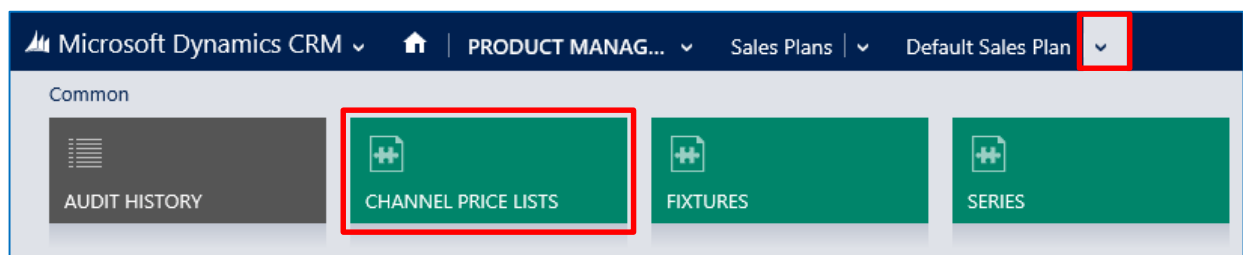
- Select or hover over the **Microsoft Dynamics CRM** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Product Management**.



- Next, in the Product Management area of CRM, select the **Product Management** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Sales Plans**.



- A list of Active Sales Plans will be displayed, select the Sales Plan type of Other which the Channel Price List is to be added to.
- With the Sales Plan form open select the small arrow situated next to the name of the Sales Plan in the Navigation bar before choosing **Channel Price List** from the drop down.



- e) A list of currently associated Channel Price Lists for that Sale Plan will be displayed, select **Add New Channel Price** List in the ribbon.

- **Name.** Enter a name for the Channel Price List. The name can be anything, but should be meaningful. We recommended including the Channel and Product which the Channel Price List relates to within the name. E.g. POS – Meal Deals
- **Channel.** Use the Look up to select the Channel the Price List applies to. For Meal Deals the POS Channel must be selected.
- **On Sale Date.** Enter a date when the Channel Price List comes into force and Meal Deal appears on sale.
- **Variant Price List.** Use the Look up to search and find the appropriate [Variant Price List](#) that is to be used when selling this product such as the Meal Deal Variant Price List created previously.
- **Off Sale Date.** Enter a date when the Channel Price List expires and the Meal Deal comes off sale.

- g) Select **Save and Close** on the ribbon.



**Note:** All other fields in the Channel Price List form that have not been described above do not need to be completed/changed.

### EXAMPLE OF CHANNEL PRICE LIST RECORD CREATED

The example below continues from the [Variant Price List](#) and [Sales Plan](#) example that were previously created for this document. It shows the Sales Plan type Other that the Meal Deal Channel Price List is linked to.

## 2. MEAL DEAL CONFIGURATIONS

Meal Deals can be set up and configured in a number of ways from a very simple format of a single Bookable product representing the Meal Deal, to allowing the Customer to select specific types of products that make up the Meal Deals. The table below describes the different types of configurations and instructions on setting these up within CRM 2015.



**Note.** Before each Meal Deal Configuration has begun, it is assumed the [Setup](#) has taken place.

## 2. MEAL DEAL CONFIGURATIONS

1. The Meal Deal consists of a specific product(s) but no specific variant(s)

For example the Meal Deal could be made up of:

4 Pints of Beer and 4 Pies

Or

3 Pints of Beer

This is done by creating a standard Bookable Product with one associated Variant (The deal) e.g. A Burger and a Pint Meal Deal

2. The Meal Deal is a combination of products with any Variant and product specific Variants

For example the Meal Deal could be made up of:

A pint of Carling and a Pie

Or

A pint of Carling and a Hotdog

Or

A pint of Carling and a Burger  
For this type of Meal Deal to be created, the Bookable Product must have a Product Modifier and Option Variants attached to it.

The specific type of pint (e.g. a Carling, Fosters or Carlsberg) or pie (chicken, steak or vegetable) or chocolate bar (Snickers, Twix or Kit Kat) cannot be selected with this type of scenario.

3. The Meal Deal consists of products and specific Variants of all products

This means the end customer will be able to choose each component of the Meal Deal.

For example the Meal Deal could be made up of:

A Pie, Pint and a Chocolate Bar

But the end customer can choose what type of pie, pint or chocolate bar they would like, for example:

The pie could be chicken, steak or vegetable

The pint could be a Fosters, Carlsberg or Guinness

The chocolate bar could be a Kit Kat, Twix or Snickers.



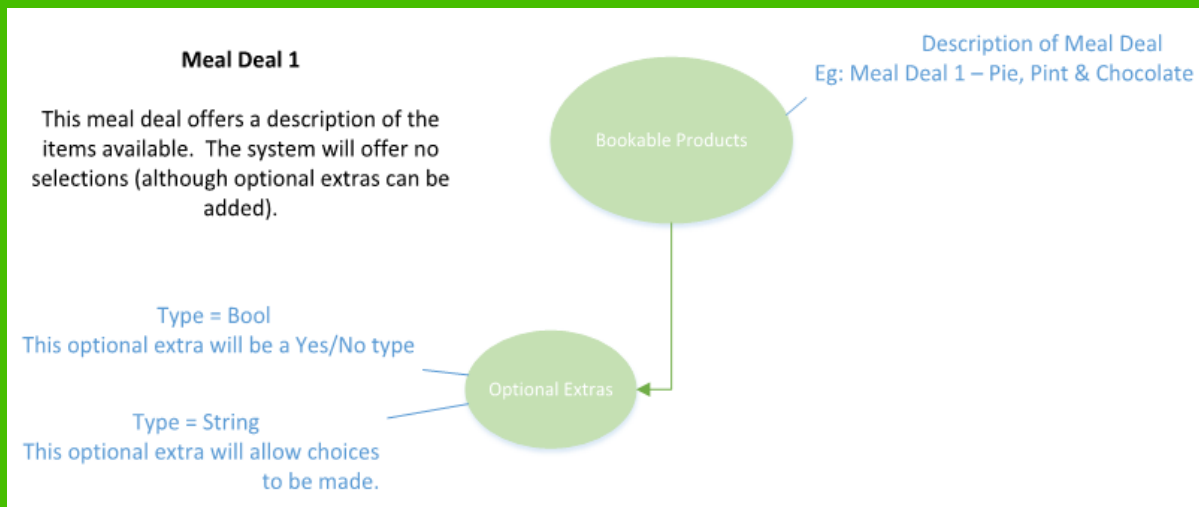
**Note:** Meal Deals do not reduce the stock of the components that make up the meal deal



## 2.1. MEAL DEAL 1: CREATING A MEAL DEAL THAT CONSISTS OF A SPECIFIC PRODUCT BUT NO SPECIFIC VARIANTS

This type of Meal Deal does not provide the operator or customer the option to select the specific products which form the Meal Deal, instead it gives a single broad option of a certain Meal Deal.

This type of Meal Deal can be created by setting up a standard Bookable Product, with one associated [Variant \(Deal\) Type](#). The diagram below demonstrates how this type of Meal Deal can be created.



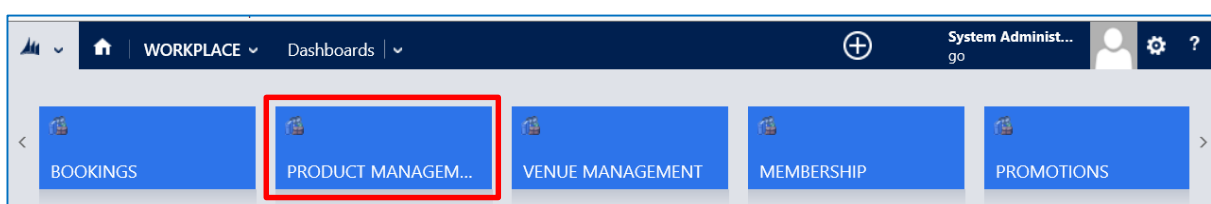
The [Setup](#) of the Meal Deal should already have been completed so that there is an appropriate Deal Variant Type, Variant Price List, Sales Plan and linked Channel Price List. If these have not been created, see [Section 1](#) of this document.

### STEP 1. CREATE THE MEAL DEAL BOOKABLE PRODUCT

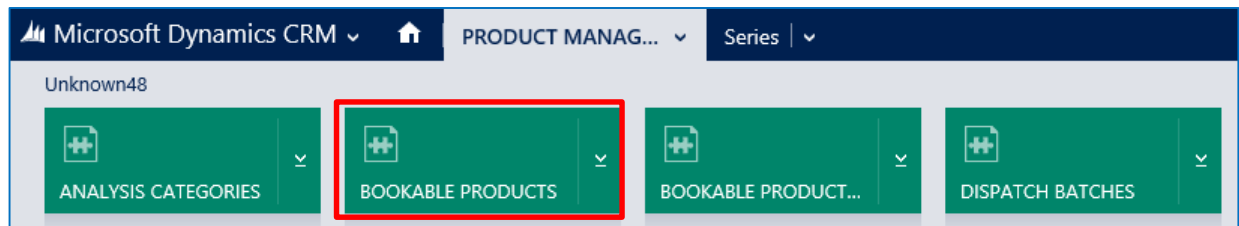
The Bookable Product entity is used to represent products that are sold, for example the Meal Deal is a bookable product. For every Meal Deal configuration you are selling through the system you must create the Bookable Product. For this first Meal Deal configuration, all that is required is a Stock type Bookable Product to be set up.

To do this, complete the following:

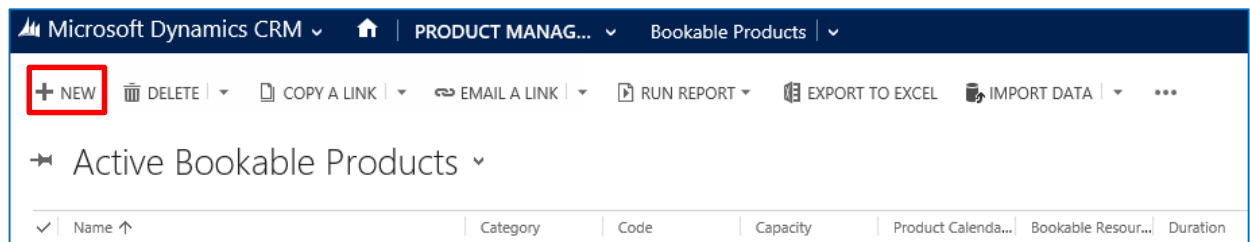
- Select or hover over the **Microsoft Dynamics CRM** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Product Management**.



- b) Next, in the Product Management area of CRM, select the **Product Management** tab before selecting **Bookable Products** from the drop down.



- c) A list of the currently active Bookable Products will be displayed. Select **New** on the ribbon.



- d) A blank Bookable Product form will be displayed. Complete the following:

General:

- **Name.** Enter a name for the product. The name will be visible to an operator and should therefore reflect the nature of the product. For example a Burger and a Pint of Fosters Meal Deal
- **Translated Name.** Used for translated implementations.
- **Description.** Enter a description of the product.
- **Type.** Use the drop-down list to select the type of product. In this instance select **Stock** from the list of available values.
- **Sequence.** If applicable, enter a sequence number for the product. The sequence number is used to determine the order in which products are displayed in the POS and Web channels.

- **Beneficiary Requirement.** Use the drop-down list to select if a customer's name is required when the product is purchased. For stock products this option should be set to **Not Required**.
- **Report Category.** Can be used for reporting purposes to categorise the products sold through Green 4 F&B.
- **Code.** Can be used to enter the barcode for products sold through the Green 4 F&B POS.
- **Is Anonymous.** Select **Yes** if the purchaser is not required to provide a name when buying the product. The channel must also be set to anonymous purchases.
- **Available Offline.** Select **Yes** if the bookable product is to be available for purchase through the offline POS. This option cannot be used for products which require capacity to be monitored.
- **Meal deal.** Select **Yes**, to show that this is a Meal Deal product. This is then used for reporting purposes.

Referring Entities:

- **Category.** Use the Look Up Records dialog to select the product category. The category is used to group products, for example Meal Deals.



**Note.** All other fields in the Bookable Product form that have not been described above do not need to be completed/changed.

- When the details are complete select **Save** on the ribbon.
- Next, it is necessary to indicate which **Channels** the product can be bought. To set the Channels carry out the following:
  - Scroll down to the **Channels** section of the Bookable Product form
  - The Channels that have been set up during the configuration on your system will be listed. Select the checkbox alongside each Channel through which the product will be sold.

- Next, it is necessary to identify the Product Variants and Prices:

  - To select a [Variant](#), in the drop-down list on the left hand side (highlighted below), select the appropriate option. All of the variants available in your system will be listed. If you have categorised the variants they will displayed in the relevant categories. For Meal Deals the Variant of **Deal** should be added.

h) Next, the price of the product must be entered, to do this:

- i. Select the relevant Meal Deal [Variant Price List](#) from the drop down at the right hand side of the Variants & Pricing section (highlighted below).

- ii. Peak Price and Off Peak Price fields will appear upon selecting the appropriate Variant Price List. In both the Peak Price and Off Peak Pricing fields the same price information should be entered.

- i) When the pricing details are complete select **Save** in the bottom right hand corner of the Bookable Product form.

- c) This will add the Meal Deal directly to the shopping cart area as the operator has no choice in selecting the specific products that are to be part of the Meal Deal.

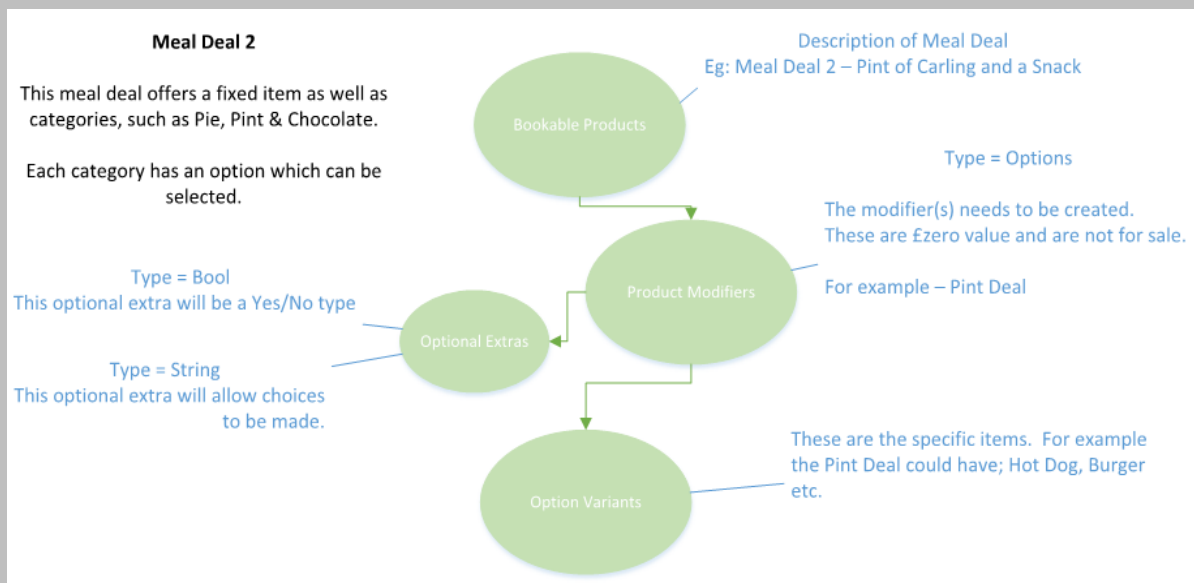

- d) Select **Add Payment** to complete the purchase of the Meal Deal.

## 2.2. MEAL DEAL 2: CREATING A MEAL DEAL THAT CONSISTS OF A COMBINATION OF PRODUCTS WITH ANY VARIANTS AND PRODUCT SPECIFIC VARIANTS

This type of Meal Deal allows the deal to consist of a combination of products that can be chosen by the operator. For example a Meal Deal may consist of a pint of Carling with a choice of food to make up the deal. Therefore there may be a deal of a pint of Carling and a hot dog, a pint of Carling and a burger or a pint of Carling and a pie. For this type of Meal Deal to be created, the bookable product must have a [Product Modifier](#) and [Option Variants](#) attached to it.

The diagram below demonstrates how this type of Meal Deal can be created.



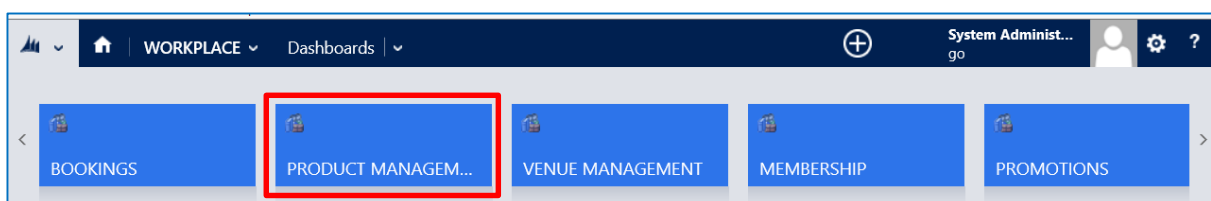
The [Setup](#) of the Meal Deal should already have been completed so that there is an appropriate Deal Variant Type, Variant Price List, Sales Plan and linked Channel Price List. If these have not been created, see [Section 1](#) of this document.

### STEP 1. CREATE THE MEAL DEALS BOOKABLE PRODUCT

The Bookable Product entity is used to represent products that are sold, for example the Meal Deal. For each Meal Deal you are selling you must create a Bookable Product. In the example being used a Bookable Product of A pint of Carling with food Meal Deal has been created.

To do this, complete the following:

- Select or hover over the **Microsoft Dynamics CRM** tab before scrolling across the drop down list of the navigation bar and selecting **Product Management**.







- **Beneficiary Requirement.** Use the drop-down list to select if a customer's name is required when the product is purchased. For stock products this option should be set to **Not Required**.
- **Report Category.** Can be used for reporting purposes to categorise the products sold through Green 4 F&B.
- **Code.** Can be used to enter the barcode for products sold through the Green 4 F&B POS.
- **Is Anonymous.** Select **Yes** if the purchaser is not required to provide a name when buying the product. The channel must be set up to anonymous purchases also.
- **Available Offline.** Select **Yes** if the bookable product is to be available for purchase through the offline POS. This option cannot be used for products that require capacity to be monitored.
- **Meal deal.** Select **Yes**, to show that this is a Meal Deal product. This is then used for reporting purposes.

Referring Entities:

- **Category.** Use the Look Up Records dialog to select the product category. The category is used to group products, for example Meal Deals.



**Note.** All other fields in the Bookable Product form that have not been described above do not need to be completed/changed.

- When the details are complete select **Save** on the ribbon.
- Next, it is necessary to indicate which **Channels** the product can be bought. To set the Channels carry out the following:

## 2.3. MEAL DEAL 3. CREATING A MEAL DEAL THAT CONSISTS OF PRODUCTS AND SPECIFIC VARIANTS OF ALL PRODUCTS

This type of Meal Deal allows the deal to consist of a combination of products which can be chosen by the operator as well as specific types of these products. It may be that the Meal Deal for a pint, a pie and a chocolate bar is set up, and the end customer will be able to choose what each component consists of. For example, a pie could be chicken, steak or vegetable; a pint could be a Fosters, Carlsberg or Guinness and a chocolate bar could be a Kit Kat, Twix or Mars Bar. The diagram below shows how this type of Meal Deal can be created.



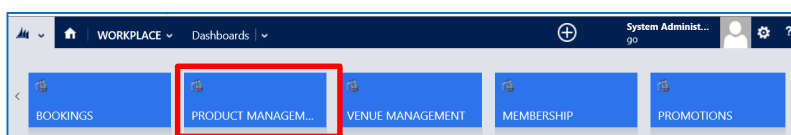

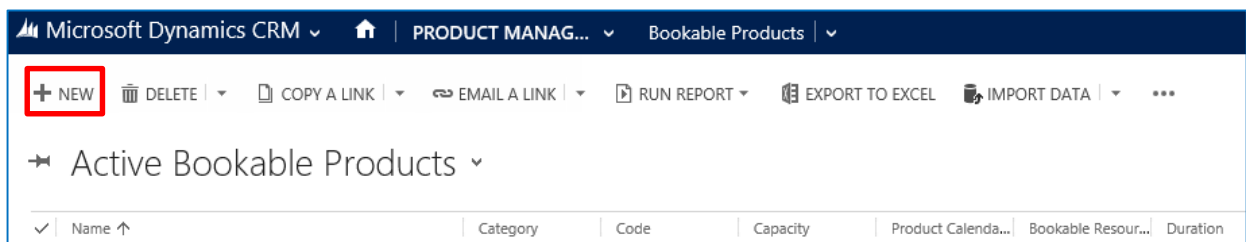

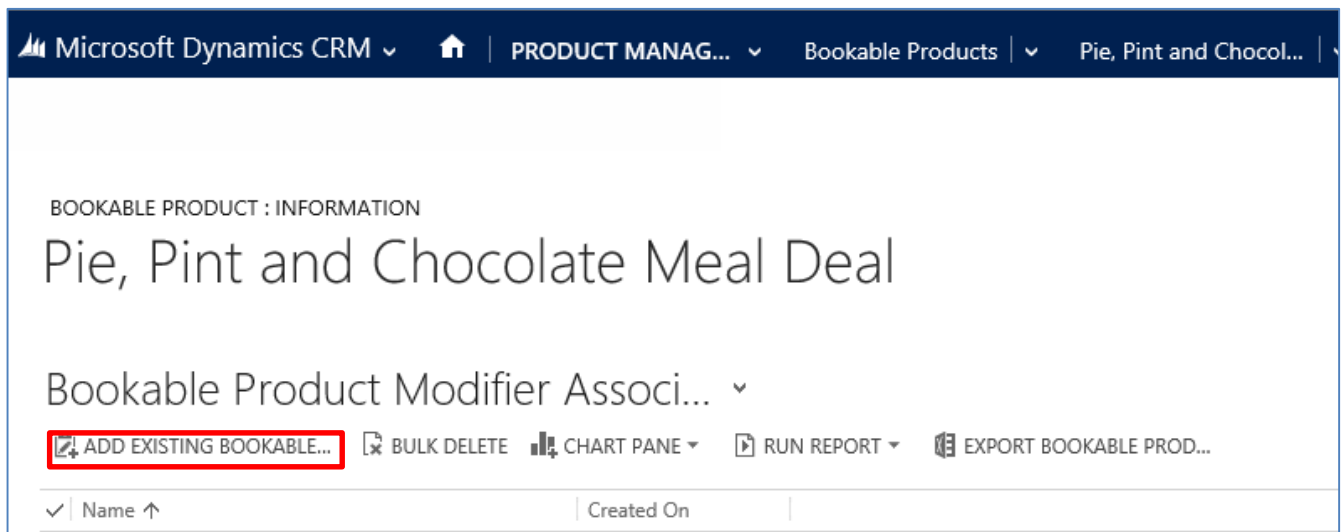
Bookable Product Modifiers must be created to link the Meal Deal Options created in [Step 2](#), for example Pie, Pint and Chocolate to the Meal Deal [\(Step 1\)](#).

To do this, complete the following:

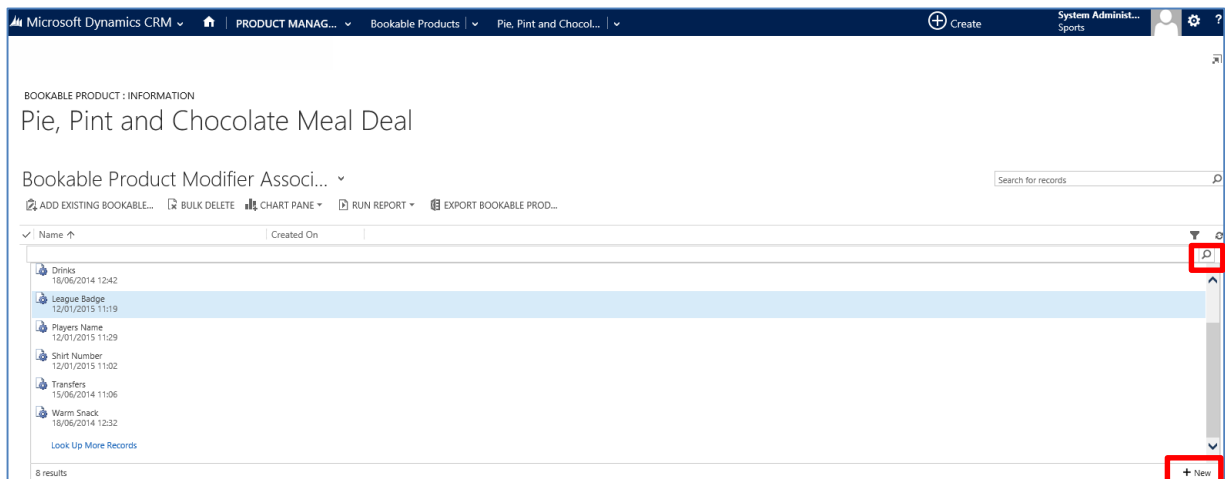

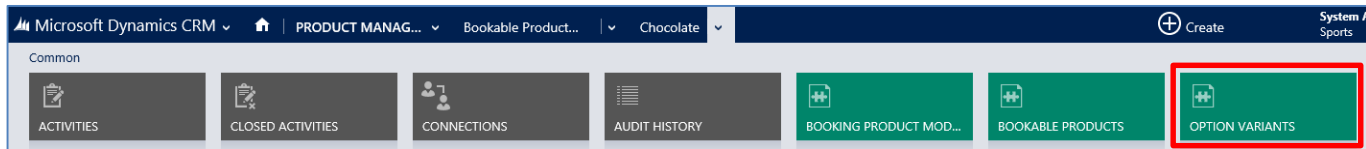

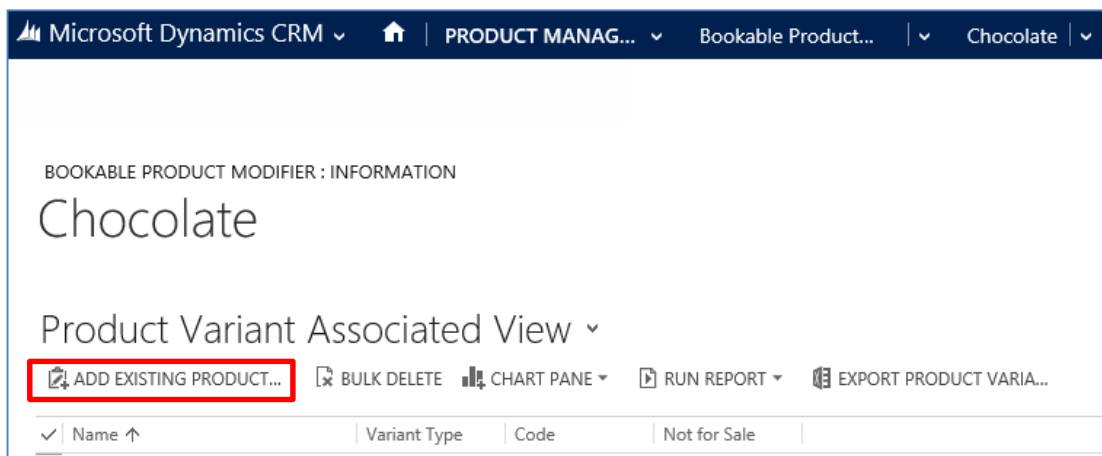
## STEP 5. CREATE THE OPTION VARIANTS

The Option Variants link the specific type of products created in [Step 3 of section 2.3](#) that are going to be offered as part of the Meal Deal. In this example these are the options of a Carlsberg, Fosters, Guinness, Mars Bar, Twix, Kit Kat, Steak pie, Chicken pie and Vegetable pie.

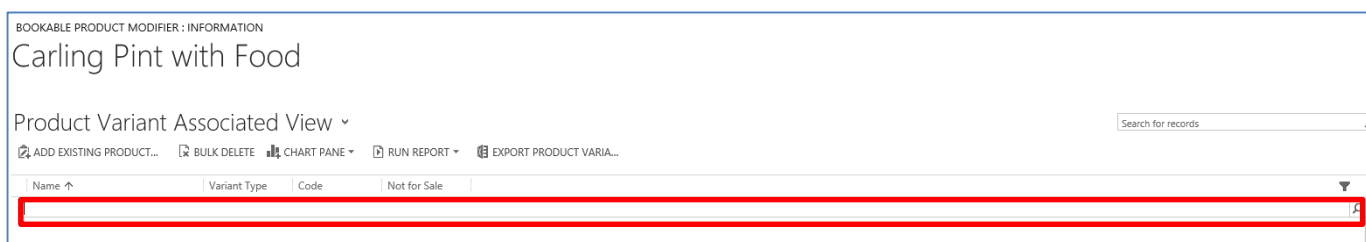
- a) With the Product Modifier form still open, select the small arrow next to the name of the Product Modifier in the navigation bar and from the drop down choose **Option Variants**.



- b) The Product Variant Associated View will be displayed, select **Add Existing Product Variant** on the ribbon.



- c) Select **Add Existing Product Variant** in the ribbon.
- d) A drop down will appear, use the magnifying glass to look up and find the Product Variants that are to be part of the Meal Deal and were previously created in [Step 3 of section 2.3](#), these should match the same category of products in the bookable Product Modifier. In this example the Bookable Product Modifier is Chocolate, the option variants that need to be found are the Chocolate type products that were previously created, these being the Twix, Mars Bar and Kit Kat.



- e) The Product Variants will be shown in the Product Variant Associated View when they have been added. After adding all the Option Variants that will make up the Meal Deal, select the Save icon in the bottom right hand corner of the screen.
- f) From here repeat [Steps 4](#) and [Step 5](#) of section 2.3 for each of the Modifiers and Option Variants that you need to create for your Meal Deal. In this example a further two Product Modifiers would have to be created as seen in the Example of [Step 4](#), these being Pint and Pie whilst the Option Variants available on the Meal Deal (The specific types of Pints and Pies) would need to be added.

### 3. OPTIONAL EXTRAS

After creating a Meal Deal in CRM it is possible to have optional extras displayed which the operator can add to the Meal Deal for an extra cost. For example a customer may have elected to have the pie, pint and chocolate Meal Deal, and with this Meal Deal for an additional cost it may be possible for the operator to select another product for example a slice of pizza or packet of crisps.

To create Optional Extras for a Meal Deal complete the following steps:

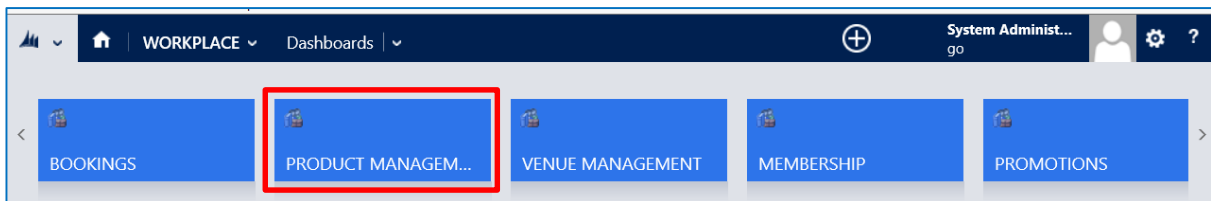
#### STEP 1. CREATE THE OPTIONAL EXTRA AS A BOOKABLE PRODUCT



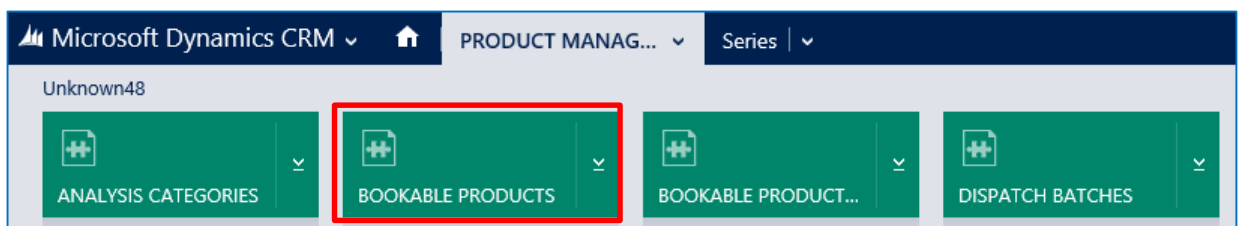

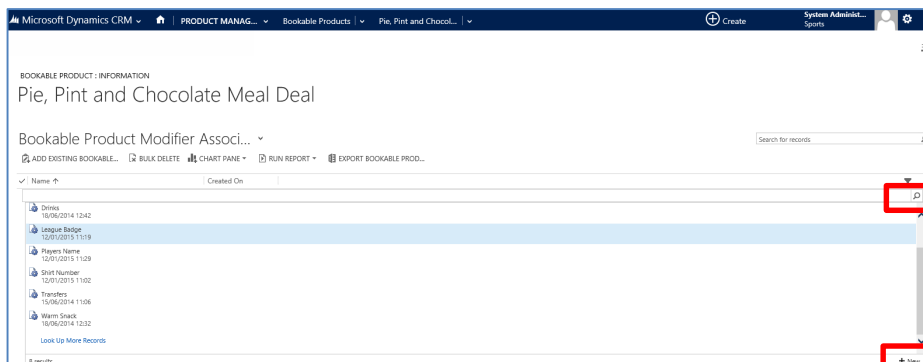

- d) The Bookable Product Modifier Associated View will be displayed, select **Add Existing Bookable Product Modifier** on the ribbon.



- e) A drop down will appear, select the magnifying glass icon and choose **New**.



f) A new Bookable Product Modifier form will be displayed. From here it is possible to either create a Bookable Product Modifier type of **String** or **Bool**.

- **String.** Select the type **String** if the Optional Extra has a number of types you can select from. For example this could be used if the Optional Extra is a Pizza Slice, as there may be different types of Pizzas that can be selected such as BBQ, Margherita or Meat Feast.

Additionally **String** will need to be selected if there is an option to customise the Optional Extra. For example the operator will be able to enter the type of Pizza that the customer is having as a blank custom option field can be displayed.

- **Bool.** Select the type **Bool** if the Optional Extra does not have differing types and is either selected by a single button to add it to the Meal Deal or is left unselected and therefore not added. For example this could be used if the Optional Extra is a single specific packet of crisps or sweets.

### Creating an Optional Extra Bookable Product Modifier Type- String

A Bookable Product Modifier type of String is used if the Optional Extra has a number of types you can select from. For example this could be used if the Optional Extra is a Pizza Slice, as there may be different types of Pizzas that can be selected such as BBQ, Margherita or Meat Feast.

a) With the Bookable Product Modifier form open, complete the following:

- **Name.** Enter a name of the Bookable Product Modifier. In this example Pizza Slice
- **Product.** Use the Look Up to find the Optional Extra Bookable Product. This would be the Bookable Product that was created in [Step 1 of section 3](#) or already exists in the system. In this example that being a Pizza Slice.
- **Is required.** Select **No**.
- **Modifier options.** Enter the differing types of the Optional Extra that are available, these must be entered and separated with a pipe ( | ) character. For example for a Pizza slice where different types of pizza can be selected, each type of pizza would need to be entered here with a pipe ( | ) separating each name: Meat Feast | BBQ | Margherita
- **Validation expression.** This field can be left blank

- **Owner.** This field will already be completed.
- **Type.** Select the type **String**.
- **Default Value.** If applicable, enter the Value which will be displayed in the POS before any other option.
- **Allow custom option.** Select **No**.

- Select **Save and Close** on the ribbon.
- The Bookable Product Modifier will have been added. Repeat the instructions for any other Bookable Product Modifiers Optional Extras that are of the type **String**.
- In the POS after selecting a Meal Deal that has had Optional Extras added to it which were created with a Bookable Product Modifier type of **String**, the POS will display the Optional Extra with a drop down menu to show the differing types of the product. This can be seen in the example below.

The appropriate type of the product can then be selected before confirming all of the contents of the Meal Deal and Optional Extras. Select **Add** to add the Meal Deal and any Optional extras to the shopping cart where it can then be paid for in the usual way. The additional cost of any selected Optional Extras will be added on top of the cost of the Meal Deal.

## Creating an Optional Extra Bookable Product Modifier Type- String- Custom Option

A Bookable Product Modifier type of **String** can also be used if the Optional Extra can be customised for the operator to enter their own description into a field. For example the operator will be able to enter the type of Pizza that the customer wants if it is not displayed in the drop down list.

a) Enter the following into the Bookable Product Modifier form:

- **Name.** Enter a name of the Bookable Product Modifier. In this example Pizza Slice.
- **Product.** Use the Look Up to find the Optional Extra Bookable Product. This would be the Bookable Product that was created in [Step 1 of Section 3](#) or already exists in the system. In this example that being a Pizza Slice.
- **Is required.** Select **No**.
- **Modifier options.** Enter the differing types of the Optional Extras available, these must be entered and separated with a pipe ( | ) character. For example for a Pizza slice where different types of pizza can be selected, each type of pizza would need to be entered here with a pipe ( | ) separating each name: Meat Feast | BBQ | Margherita.

It is also possible to leave this field blank which will also leave an appropriate blank field in the POS so that an operator can enter the product into it.

- **Validation expression.** This field can be left blank.
- **Owner.** This field will already be completed.
- **Type.** Select the type **String**.
- **Default Value.** If applicable, enter the Value that will be displayed in the POS before any other option.
- **Allow custom option.** Select **Yes**.

b) Select **Save and Close** in the ribbon.

c) The Bookable Product Modifier will have been added. Repeat the instructions for any other Bookable Product Modifier optional Extras that are of the type String and allow a Custom Option.

d) In the POS after selecting a Meal Deal that has had Optional Extras added to it which were created with a Bookable Product Modifier type of String and the **Allow Custom Option** flag set to **Yes**, as described above, the POS will display the Optional Extra with a Custom Option field, where the operator can enter text. This is shown in the example below.

If necessary Text can then be added before confirming all of the contents of the Meal Deal and Optional Extras. Select **Add** to add the Meal Deal and any Optional extras to the shopping cart where it can then be paid for in the normal way. The additional cost of the Optional Extra will be added on top of the cost of the Meal Deal.

### Creating an Optional Extra Bookable Product Modifier Type- Bool

A Bookable Product Modifier type of **Bool** is used if the Optional Extra does not have differing types and is either selected by a single button to add it as an Optional Extra or is simply not selected and is not added. For example this could be used if the Optional Extra is a single specific packet of crisps or sweets.

a) Enter the following into the Bookable Product Modifier form.

- **Name.** Enter a name of the Bookable Product Modifier, for example Crisps.
- **Product.** Use the Look Up to find the Optional Extra Bookable Product. This would be the Bookable Product that was created in [Step 1 of Section 3](#) or which already exists in the system. In this example that being Crisps.
- **Is required.** Select **No**.
- **Modifier options.** This field can be left blank.
- **Validation expression.** This field can be left blank.
- **Owner.** This field will already be completed.
- **Type.** Select the type **Bool**.
- **Default Value.** This field can be left blank.
- **Allow custom option.** Select **No**.

- b) Select **Save and Close** in the ribbon.
- c) The Bookable Product Modifier will have been added. Repeat the instructions for any other Bookable Product Modifiers Optional Extras that are of the type Bool.
- d) In the POS after selecting a Meal Deal that has had Optional Extras added to it which were created with a Bookable Product Modifier type of Bool, as described above, the POS will display the Optional Extra with a button. This is shown in the example below.

If the Optional extra is to be added to the Meal Deal, the button which can be selected will turn orange and the wording will change from **Not Selected** to **Selected**. Select **Add** to add the Meal Deal and the Optional Extras to the shopping cart where it can then be paid for in the usual way. The additional cost of any selected Optional Extras will be added on top of the cost of the Meal Deal.

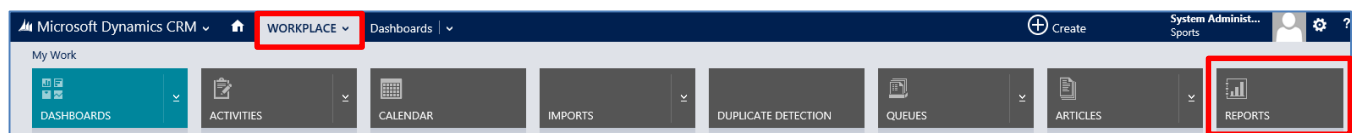

A Meal Deal Report is available and can be generated to display what Meal Deals have been sold and the Meal Deal choices that have been selected. Any optional extras that have been added to the Meal Deal are also shown in the report.

To generate the report complete the following in CRM:

- On the home page of CRM, select **Workplace** on the navigation area before choosing **Reports** from the drop down.



- A list of Available Reports will be shown, find the **Meal Deal** report and double click on it for the Report Viewer screen to open.
- Select the **Run Report** button.

- d) The Meal Deal report will be generated. The example below shows the layout of a Meal Deal report. Please note there are 2 pages of the report with the second page displaying more detailed information:
